## Working together

It's somehow March already and so far we seem to have escaped the worst ravages of winter and our thoughts are now turning to spring. The HARA Committee have a few things already planned, including a Litter Pick Up in April, to tidy up the village before the grass starts to grow, and a Fun Saturday in May as a fundraising and entertainment event.

One very positive aspect of Hatton is the level of cooperation that exists between the various community and voluntary groups within the village. We will be looking at organising more fundraising events later this year, not only to fund future HARA projects but to continue helping other groups who are active within the village : be it the Brownies, the Firework Display, the Toddlers Group, HATS, or any of the others we have assisted over the years. HARA receives core funding for basic operating costs (hire of the Hall for meetings, printing this Newsletter, committee skills training, etc) from Aberdeenshire Council's Housing Service in our capacity as a Registered Tenant Organisation but other expenditure has to be met from other sources of funding, primarily fundraising. We have successfully bid in the past for monies from the Shell Small Grants Scheme (organised by the BDP) and from the Council's Area Initiative Fund for specific projects. If you have ideas for future projects that would benefit the village please let us know.

## **Self Directed Support in Aberdeenshire**

The Social Care (Self-Directed Support) (Scotland) Act 2013 is due to be implemented on 1 April 2014. The Local Authority will have a duty to offer four options to those assessed as eligible for Social Work support.

1. A Direct Payment where you can choose how the budget is used and you manage the money
2. You direct how the budget is used, but money is managed by someone else (sometimes called an Individual Service Fund).
3. You ask the Council to choose and arrange services for you.
4. You can choose a mix of these options for different types of support.



The poem is printed on the next page. We hope you enjoy reading about Hatton in the olden days, when there were all sorts of shops and a school bursting at the seams, not to mention characters a plenty.



Come Cruden folks, bring to yer min's  
When we were wee bit loons an' quines:  
Hatton then was unco sma' -  
Some stob-thacket hooses in a raw,  
A cottage planted here and there;  
O' grocers' shops there wis a pair;





Please could dog owners pick up after their dog(s) and keep the village clean and looking good for all its residents and visitors. Please discard dog poo in ordinary rubbish bins.


