Parking Matters

Along with others, HARA has argued for years to stop school buses doing dangerous reversing manoeuvres when children are running about, children who are often highly excited having just got out from school or off the bus.

There have also been a number of near misses of cars coming downhill when buses reversed from Park View uphill into Hatton Farm Road. This campaign seems to have finally paid off and the bus drivers have begun following the designated bus route (Park View, Hatton Farm Gardens, Hatton Farm Road).

However, this success is very much in jeopardy as buses continue to find their passage impeded by drivers (invariably residents of the street concerned) parking in a manner that prevents the buses getting past. In one recent case, the householder concerned was apparently very reluctant to move the vehicle to let the bus through and promptly parked in the same obstructive manner once the bus had passed.

People need to realise that it is not only buses but also large

delivery vehicles, refuse trucks, fire engines and ambulances that need unimpeded access, and drivers need to ensure they leave adequate space for free passage.

Pedestrians also raise concerns about vehicles blocking pavements, forcing them to go around by walking on the roadway. While in many instances this may be an attempt to leave the street clear for vehicles to pass, there needs to be room left on the pavement for pedestrians, child buggies and wheelchair users to get past.

The other parking bugbear that is frequently raised about areas with limited parking, and has been mentioned before in this newsletter, is of multiple vehicle households having a driveway, but still taking up other parking places on the street for a second car, rather than park in front of their own driveway.



Planning for Real

Back in 2009 HARA organised a *Planning for Real* exercise that was facilitated by the Buchan Development Partnership (BDP). I'm sure some of you will remember visiting us in the Hall or the School and adding your suggestions to the cardboard and papier-mâché scale model of the village on display. Many of the ideas and issues highlighted from that effort have been progressed over the years but some are sadly still just something to aim for in the future.

So, as part of the recent Fun Saturday event, there was the opportunity to revisit the *Planning for Real* approach, albeit on a simpler scale using large scale maps of Hatton, kindly provided to us by the Council's Planning Service.

We were interested to see what people's priorities were now and what, if any, concerns they had about aspects of the village. At the time of writing we still have to discuss all the ideas, suggestions and issues raised and investigate how these can be progressed, but a quick glance shows that there are a few

common themes:

- more and better play park equipment is needed
- people would like an off road walkway/cycleway for families (and dogs)
- tidying up and/or development of a couple of derelict sites within the village
- concerns about vehicles around the School area (cars, lorries and school buses) at school times
- concerns about inconsiderate car parking along the bus route (Hatton Farm Gardens in particular)
- speeding vehicles both within the village and on the A90

With a few exceptions, all the suggestions were about recreational activities, for both adults and children, or were about road safety and similar vehicle issues. Comments about play park provision outnumbered all the other comments put together.

A number of the suggestions relate to things that are already being looked at, including the

play park equipment and tidying up of derelict sites.

The traffic issues are an ongoing concern. HARA carried out a survey a few years ago with the aim of getting a pedestrian crossing and/or a school crossing patroller but the feedback from the Council was that the volume of traffic (both vehicle and pedestrian) did not justify such a thing. The idea of a public walkway was one of the ideas from the 2009 study that have so far not come to fruition.

What surprised us on this occasion was the lack of comment about future housing development or about the availability of public transport. Although there was information

on the table about the proposal to permanently close the Bishop's Bridge to vehicular traffic, there were no comments actually posted about this and the closure was only raised in conversation when we specifically mentioned it. However we did have some interesting conversations about who actually owned parts of the village and about where things like the Mill Dam and Old Manse were located.

A fuller report will follow in due course. What was good to see was the number of children and young people expressing their ideas for the village, interestingly not all that different from the issues highlighted by the adults.

Driving on rural roads

Speeding vehicles was one of the issues identified from the *Planning for Real* exercise at the recent HARA Fun Saturday, and one which is a regular source of complaint to HARA.



Drivers on rural roads need to drive with due care and attention, adapting their speed to the nature of the road and the distance ahead they can see.

This is the main concern about the closure of the Bishop's Bridge and people having to use the Ardiffery Road (U79B) to access Cruden Church and the Cemetery. This road is very narrow, with a number of blind bends and driver behaviour most certainly a cause for concern, as is the speed of some vehicles using the Hobshill/Auquharney (MP153) road where an increase in traffic has been noticed by residents.

HOUSING - Report to the Scottish Housing Regulator

With the introduction of the Scottish Social Housing Charter in 2013 (the "Tenants Charter") all social housing providers have to collect information on their own performance and submit an annual report to the Scottish Housing Regulator. The first of these Annual Returns on the Charter (ARC) had to be submitted by 31st May this year.

The Regulator will assess these ARC reports and compare landlords' performance and publish their findings in August. It is then the landlord's duty to issue a report to their tenants on the performance and the Regulator's assessment and this has to be done before the end of October each year.

The Regulator expects that tenants will take a keen interest in how their landlord is performing and be prepared to scrutinise both the performance and how the landlord operates, identifying areas needing improvement to the service provided.

So those of you in the village who are tenants of Aberdeenshire Council or of Aberdeenshire Housing Partnership (the only two social landlords we are aware of with properties in the village), you will be receiving a Tenant Report on your landlord's performance this Autumn. The exact form this Tenant Report will take is still being discussed by each landlord.

Aberdeenshire Council, however, will be incorporating the results of their recent Tenant Satisfaction Survey in the report to their tenants. This survey attracted a really good response with over 5,000 tenants (43.5%) returning the questionnaire. The prize draw that was offered to encourage a good response was won by a tenant from Kintore. If you would like more information about the Charter or are interested in getting involved in scrutiny of your landlord's performance, please let us know.

Please bag it and bin it!

Most dog owners are responsible and clean up after their dog, disposing of the bag of waste properly. However HARA has been asked again to remind owners to pick up after their dog(s) and keep the village clean and looking good for all its residents and visitors.



One current problem area is the Hobshill/Auquharney road (MP153) where dog poo bags are being left at the roadside.

Picking up and bagging the dog mess is not the end of an owner's responsibility - they then have to take the bag and dispose of it in a proper manner, in a litter bin, dog waste bin, or take it home to their own bin.

This is not the only place in the village people abandon used dog waste bags - even Park View is not immune. Leaving filled bags lying about, tossing them into other people's gardens, or hanging them on fences is totally disgusting - worse than just leaving the mess itself.

It's their dog, they need to clean up after it and dispose of the mess properly. There is no excuse. It does not matter if there is a nearby bin or not. If necessary they should take it home. Dog waste bins are provided in certain locations as a convenience, but the responsibility for cleaning up remains with the dog owner.






