## **Council Tenant Rent Consultation**

Aberdeenshire Council has a 30 Year Business Plan for its housing stock that commenced in 2000. It is reviewed at three year intervals and the next review is due later this year and will impact on rent levels from April 2016.

The Council will be looking at the cost of planned maintenance and upgrade works over the next three years on top of the ongoing costs of repairs and staffing and will be factoring in funding towards building more new council housing to complement the almost 200 new council homes that have been built in Aberdeenshire in recent years.

As part of the review, the views of the 12,750 council tenants are being asked for in a Rent Consultation Questionnaire that will be sent to every tenant household at the end of September. The tenants preference for the various options available will influence what proposed rent levels are finally put before the Councillors for a decision next February.

So if you are one of the approx 100 council tenants in the village, please look out for the consultation arriving in your mail later this month and make sure you respond and give your views on potential rent levels and your priorities for housing over the next few years.

If you have any difficulty completing the Questionnaire, there will be contact details of people to contact in the accompanying letter but also feel free to contact HARA if you need advice.

## HARA receives funding for a Community Public Access Defibrillator



Those of you with a good memory may remember late last year we applied for funding from the Scottish Government for a Public Access Defibrillator. During the last year we have been in discussion with the Scottish Ambulance Service who agreed there was a need for a CPAD in Hatton along with many other towns and villages across Scotland. Keep an eye out for the green or yellow cabinets and even re-purposed phone boxes on your travels!

Each year 100,000 people die from sudden cardiac arrest in the UK. Out-of-hospital cardiac arrest is the commonest life-threatening medical emergency in Scotland. It can affect anyone at any time, and often happens to people with no prior signs of ill health. Due to our rural location help may have to come from quite a distance and every second counts.

We have subsequently received the defibrillator, but this came with the caveat that it must be placed in an external heated cabinet and be available 24/7. We did not receive funding for this from the Scottish Government so we therefore applied to the Buchan Development Partnership and received £750 from the Shell Small Grants scheme. We would like to thank them for their support.

It has been agreed that the CPAD will be located on the outside of the village hall in a secure cabinet. This has been agreed as the best location where most people will benefit. You should see this appear soon. We hope to have the CPAD live by the end of September.

We would ask all users of the car park and hall **not to park next to the cabinet**, to allow quick access in an emergency.

Once the CPAD is installed it can be accessed by dialling 999/112 and following the instructions from the Ambulance Service call handler. The defibrillator is supplied with basic CPR equipment and is suitable for use on infants/ children and adults.



There will be sessions at the hall for anyone to come and learn CPR and how to use the AED. More details on this to follow.

## **Tenants Talking to Tenants – *Coffee At The Council*** **Buchan House, St Peter Street, Peterhead** **10am – 12 Noon** **Friday 18th September**

The core group of council tenants elected to oversee tenant involvement activities in Aberdeenshire, the Tenant Participation Promotion Team (or TPPT for short), have been holding Roadshows across Aberdeenshire to encourage other tenants to get more involved and contribute their views and ideas to improving the housing service being provided.

As an extension to information stalls at supermarkets and gala days, the tenants on TPPT have recently started holding drop-in sessions in council housing offices that they are calling “***Coffee At The Council***”. This provides an opportunity for tenants to go along and have an informal chat over a cup of tea or coffee with fellow tenants about any housing issues or concerns they have and get more information on the various ways tenants can get more involved and make their views known.

The next such drop-in is being held next Friday, 18th September, in the new Buchan House offices at St Peter Street in Peterhead. The tenants on TPPT are your tenant representatives and have the ear of senior management, so if there are housing issues that you are struggling to get resolved, this is your opportunity to discuss the problems you are having with fellow tenants and get their advice about how to proceed.

As an added incentive, they have got the Area Manager to agree to provide a couple of conducted tours of the new building for tenants who would like to see what has been built to replace the multitude of council offices that previously existed around Peterhead.

At the time of writing it is planned that the drop-in session will be from 10am – 12 Noon and the conducted tours at 10:30am and 11:30am but please look out for further publicity to confirm these times. If you would like to get a tour of the building, please make sure you turn up in plenty time before the planned tour times.

## **New numbers means calling the council is now cheaper for mobile users**

Aberdeenshire Council has made changes to the way that residents can contact the council by phone.

The council has simplified the list of phone numbers available and also moved from 0845 prefixed numbers to 0345 prefixed numbers.

The main benefit of using 0345 numbers is that they can now be included as part of a mobile package, meaning customers will no longer be charged at a premium rate when calling Aberdeenshire Council from a mobile.

For those calling the council from a landline, calls will continue to be charged at local rates.

The updated numbers are outlined below, although the existing 0845 numbers will remain active for emergency calls.
