We have fundraised and over the years built play areas for children from toddlers to teenagers, installed bench seating around the village, helped set up Hatton In Bloom, organised a "Planning for Real" event, and our latest venture, sourcing funding for a defibrillator for the village - which has been acquired and is currently awaiting an electrician to install.

Then even further from view, was the sight of the magnificent, severe, North Sea.

But most of all, her biggest wish was to live in the village of her dreams with the added luxury of a small bakery, where, in the morning you could buy fresh warm bread rolls, and where a huge warm fragrant aroma of fresh bread, and pastries with fresh cream was abundant and filled the air.
