Celebrating *TWENTY* years of HARA


The date has been set for the celebration – mark your calendar for **Saturday 13th May**. Come along, show your community spirit – there will be refreshments too.

Playpark

The end of January saw the revealing, at long last, of the proposed scheme to develop and enhance the main Playpark in the village, next to the shop on Station Road. Barely a week later the contractors were on site to install the largest and most exciting piece of the scheme, a multi-climb unit. February 2nd saw the fences come down and the kids go up. This is a project some seven years in the making and HARA is both grateful to Aberdeenshire Council for their

funding and logistical support and to the Hall Committee for agreeing to enhance and extend the Playpark and advising on locations of drains etc. Particular thanks go to the former Principal Landscape Services officer, Ian Tillet, who first pledged core funding and protected those finds until we raised enough to move forward with Phase 1.

You can see the full proposed scheme below and on the Facebook page in full colour. The next phases will bring more



play things for a range of ages but we need funding and we need help to deliver the project. Please do get in touch if you would be willing to help fund-raise to complete the Play Park

Project. We would also really love to upgrade the other parks in the village, but we need your help!

Housing Walkabout

Sharp eyed residents noticed a gaggle of blue jacketed Council officials touring about the village on a *caul, weat* day in December. This was a Council Housing "walkabout" with HARA reps and tenants and was to look at the external condition and quality of the environment around the council housing in Hatton.

We were surprised to see so many officials waiting for us, to do the walkabout. Surely nothing to do with the Chair of the Council's Housing and Social Work Committee (now Communities) being on HARA?

A good number of issues were identified with roofs, chimneys, railings, car parks and pavements, among other things and various maintenance and improvement plans identified.

Thanks to the Housing Service, especially Jill Matthews, Tennant Participation Officer for arranging the walkabout.

HARA on Facebook

Our Facebook page has been active for a number of years and as at 1st February 2017 it has 541 members, increasing steadily. Definitely a success story!

The page is "moderated", only in the sense that you have to request to join, in order to post messages and any unacceptable messages posted could be removed. Otherwise it is publicly viewable. No one, so far, has had their membership revoked and only one message, a couple of years ago, was deemed unacceptable and removed. Recently someone "reported" a post to Facebook but, when we reviewed it, we thought the anger expressed about dangerous driving was perfectly understandable and took no action.

There is unfortunately an increasing tendency for some quite negative comments to appear and, sadly, some dismissive comments about others who have expressed a valid opinion. I am sure it is no surprise that these generally come from those who do not get involved in assisting with village activities but like to carp from the sidelines. Some people are never happy, no matter what others do for the village. Repeat offenders may find that their membership is terminated.

Going forward, please remember that the intention of the page is to keep people aware of what is happening in the village and highlight anything of general interest. It is NOT the intention that it becomes an advertising site for people running businesses - you can advertise through this newsletter or

there are dedicated local advertising pages elsewhere on Facebook. There is no issue with people asking for advice or recommendations but people joining solely to advertise their product or service will have such advertising removed.

Over the years we have tried our best to restrict membership to those who live in Hatton and the surrounding rural area and to those who used to live here and/or still have family connections to Hatton. Around three quarters of current requests to join come from people with no obvious connection to the area. Scantily clothed young ladies from SE Asia, or men whose profiles only contain photos of such women, are easy to discard but a large number of requests come from people whose location is unknown. If you, or someone you know, wants to join, please ensure that your own Facebook page shows some obvious connection with Hatton. If you have no obvious connection to the area, or we do not recognise your name (because we don't know that you live in the village), then the request will not be processed unless you get in touch. So please message us. We do try to respond to new requests at least once a week but bear with us if occasionally there is a longer delay.



Defibrillator instruction

Unfortunately the defibrillator instruction courses arranged for January 12th and 19th had to be postponed at short notice due to weather conditions and other unforeseen problems. Blue Watch have apologised for this unreservedly. New dates have now been confirmed; The crew of White Watch (from Peterhead Fire Station), will be leading the instruction on February 9th and 16th at Hatton Hall, 7pm. These stations will be filled with dog poo bags which are freely available for anyone who needs one.




