## What is a Community?

Local and national newspapers recently reported that the first wildlife bridges in Scotland will be featured as part of the Aberdeen Western Peripheral Route (AWPR.) Along with eighteen under passes they will allow the safe passage of wildlife from one side of the road to the other in order to keep the community whole. The bridges will take the form of two dedicated 'ecoducts' to be constructed over the new road at Kingcausie and Kirkhill, areas surrounded by large tracts of woodland. In addition, a further bridge at Kirkhill will be used by vehicles to access local forests and remote properties but will have one half of its carriageway landscaped for wildlife and equestrian use.

There will be many who welcome the fact that protecting wildlife and retaining biodiversity has been a serious consideration at both the planning and construction stage. There will however also be those who wonder why so much money is being spent on this aspect of the project, after all they're 'just animals' This latter view belies the fact that Scotland's animals and plants actually contribute around £1.4 billion a year to the economy *via* 'Nature Tourism'.

But there is also an intrinsic value to the animals and plants that surround us; without insect pollinators we'd have no food. Without the predators that feed on them we'd be overrun. Plants not only provide much of our food but as every schoolchild knows also provides the oxygen we need. Trees are especially good at this and also absorb pollutants.

It might surprise some to learn that in a recent speed survey more than 13,000 vehicles journeys were recorded in just one seven day period along Station Road and Main Street in Hatton. That's quite a lot of pollution, which could be mitigated if Hatton had more trees. It might also surprise some to learn that the definition of a community is all of the animals and all of the plants living in an area. It includes the human population but is much more than this single aspect.

In the coming years Hatton's population will increase as new houses are built. Perhaps we should be thinking how we might increase the community as well.

The idea is that people offer their repair skills for free so that items that might otherwise end up in landfill are given a new lease of life and the owner saves both money and resources.

Personally, my repair skills are limited to fairly basic sewing skills so I would be happy undertake simple jobs like sewing on buttons, repairing tears and sewing up hems that have fallen down.

The item most of taken to Repair Cafes and the item most often successfully fixed is the humble push bike, so if you have bike fixing skills you are sure to be in demand, but I am sure that many other skills would be appreciated

What is in it for the repairers? Mostly the warm fuzzy glow that you will get from knowing that you have saved a fellow villager a bit of money and helped towards making the world a slightly greener place. According to the Repair Café website 'In the past year, Repair Café repairers around the world have prevented 250,000 kilos of waste. Repair Café International Foundation presents that estimate in its 2016 annual report.'

Whether you bring an item along or do the repairing it will be a good chance for community bonding accompanied by a hot drink and a biscuit. 

