Here are the answers to the Tree Quiz we printed in the last edition of the newsletter.

Q1 Approximately how many different species of insect are associated with (or rely on) Oak trees as a habitat (or place to live)?

Mature Oak trees support around 450 different species of insect. The longer a tree has been native to a country or area the more life it supports. Oak trees are considered to have been native to the UK longer than any other tree species. Around half of the insect species are pollinators that we rely on for our food crops. Many are also predators keeping other species in check. All insects can provide a food source for other animals or species of carnivorous plant. (Yes! Six in Scotland.)

Q2 Approximately how many litres of water can a mature tree 'drink' each day in summer?

Though dependant on a number of factors such as temperature and habitat, a mature tree can take in between 250 and 1350 litres of water each day. In Scotland. For example it is estimated that the average intake by an Oak tree is 450 litres per day in summer. Trees act to consolidate soil and vastly reduce the effects of flooding. Though rarely any longer newsworthy the removal of forest trees to use as cooking fuel in Bangladesh causes annual flooding, leading to hundreds of deaths each year.

Q3 How long could you survive on the oxygen given out by a mature tree in one day?

On average a tree provides enough oxygen in one day to support the needs of four people. Additionally one tree will remove more than one tonne of Carbon from the atmosphere in its lifetime along with many dangerous pollutants. A recent study in Europe has shown that people living close to roads that are tree-lined had a longer life span than those who don't have trees close by.

Unbelievably, more than 200,000 acres of forest are burned every day. That is more than 150 acres lost every minute of every day, and 78 million acres lost every year!

It's an easy mistake to think we are in no way responsible for these figures. Have a look at the ingredients on the back of food you buy; is there any PALM OIL in the list? Have you noticed AVOCADOS in your supermarket year round? Have they always been this common?

Both plants are grown on land where once rainforest existed.





