## **Vandalism in School Grounds**

Dear member of the Hatton community,

I am writing to make you aware of a disappointing situation we have been recently experiencing here at Hatton (Cruden) School. We have seen an increase in the number of incidents where school property has been vandalised which started before the summer break. This has been happening out of school hours.

We have been working hard to develop our outdoor playground and the activities and toys on offer for the children to use both at playtimes and during targeted group work with staff members throughout the school day. Before the holidays, the newly created 'Fairy Garden' that the children created with Mrs Duncan was vandalised which was very upsetting for the children and staff who worked hard to create it and use it.

When we returned to school this week, we found that the P1 outdoor kitchen has had its doors bent and ripped off, there was broken glass in all areas of the playground and other items including bits of timber and guttering were left around the site. The biggest disappointment is that our blue playhouse which contains our infant outdoor toys has been repeatedly accessed by prying open the window. Children have been using the window to climb in and out of the playhouse. The toys inside have been left on more than one occasion in a mess with many items damaged and broken. This has an impact on the quality of outdoor provision we can offer the children and has taken staff time to reorganise and

sort out. When you start to think of other potential scenarios and escalated activities that could occur such as the children starting a fire in there or having a serious injury when climbing in and out, it is a worrying prospect for our community.

This is a difficult situation, as without specific details or video evidence, we are limited in what we can do. However, if we work together, we can perhaps make a difference within the school and the surrounding local community. If you do see anything untoward out of school hours, we would appreciate it if you could report it to the police and to the school. I am currently liaising with the Community Police and they are advising and supporting the school moving forward with this. I am more than happy to raise any other community concerns you may have or know about when I meet with them. Please contact me using the details above or pop in to make an appointment for a chat.

## The Parish of Cruden – Church of Scotland

Dear Friends,

At the time of writing I am preparing for a number of important events including Harvest Festival and Remembrance Sunday. The first 'modern' Harvest Festival as we would recognise it, was held back in 1843 in the Cornish village of Morwenstow. The minister at the time, the Rev R S Hawker, is recorded as being an eccentric but popular character. Writing to all the members of the local community, he invited them to respond to God's generosity by holding a special service. The whole community responded and the following Sunday they decorated the church. Each and every farmer and small holder brought a selection of the harvest. There was grain from the fields, apples from the orchard, vegetables from the garden, eggs from the hen house etc. Word soon spread of the congregation's activities. Other churches copied and within a couple of decades Harvest Festival became an annual event in churches all over the world.

I think Harvest Festival became popular for a number of reasons. In a previous generation when food was not so plentiful, the end of the harvest came as a great relief. The crops had been safely gathered in (meaning food for the farmers and their family and farm workers and their families, not forgetting the local community). It signalled the end of long hours of back breaking toil. The harvest offering of fruit, vegetables and other produce was distributed amongst the poor of the parish. And then there was the opportunity to sing some cracking harvest hymns such as 'We plough the fields and scatter' and the sheer beauty of a church appropriately decorated for the occasion.

Today Harvest Festival has taken on a new significance. Whilst it remains a timely reminder that 'All good gifts around us are sent from heaven above' it challenges us to think about our connectedness with each other and our responsibility towards creation. For example, what kind of world are we handing on to our next generation – to our children and our children's children? The protest group Extinction Rebellion may be unlawfully creating significant disruption, but they do have a point to make! There is a strong argument that Harvest should focus our thoughts and minds and remind us of our own personal responsibility and obligation at how we use the world's resources. Within the church we are currently exploring ways of reducing our carbon footprint, including installing new LED lighting and an eco-friendly heating system.

Also taking place on the 10th November is Remembrance Sunday. This will be my first Remembrance Sunday as minister of the Parish of Cruden

and I will have the privilege of leading the Acts of Remembrance at Cruden Parish Church and outside Hatton Public Hall. As a former Chaplain to the Territorial Army, I take this responsibility extremely seriously. There are still people who have first-hand memories of the people whose names are inscribed on the war memorials. I will of course strive to offer a thoughtful and appropriate time for remembering and reflection, as we seek to honour the memory of the people who made the ultimate sacrifice for justice and peace.


