#### **Lisa Watson**


Lisa is the HARA Treasurer.



The Community Pantry is open to residents of Hatton, Longhaven, Cruden and the immediate surrounding area.



#### Cruden Parish Church of Scotland

#### **Dear Friends**

Just before the summer holidays I was speaking with a group of primary school pupils. Much to my surprise, they mentioned the fire which destroyed the church in Hatton. The fire took place on the 18th February 2015. Here was the surprise. Why was this such an important memory, that it was recalled by children who were unlikely to have witnessed the fire?

The history of the church in Hatton is a wee bit complicated. For many centuries it was part of the Parish of Cruden. A physical place of worship within the village of Hatton can be traced back to 1843 with an event called the Disruption, when about one third of the elders and ministers left the Church of Scotland to form the Free Church. The local minister at the time was the Rev Alexander Philip. Almost 500 members and three elders along with the minister left Cruden Parish Church and set up a new church in the village of Hatton. It was a modest wooden structure located near Hatton Mill, until a new building was opened on the 19th of August 1885.

In 1929 Hatton Free Church rejoined the Church of Scotland and became Cruden West Church. In 1960 history came full circle when both Cruden West and Cruden Old Churches were finally reunited. Between 1960 and 1990 the building went through many changes, but a declining congregation and a requirement for major repairs led to its closure on the 31st December 2007.

The loss of a significant landmark by fire is a major event in the history of any community. The cause of the fire was, I understand due to arson, with the culprits never identified. All that remains of the church is an empty piece of ground. The church bell and cross did survive the fire. But otherwise, all that remains is memories, which are still keenly felt into the present time. Fortunately, the church is much more than buildings. It is the people of God who follow Jesus Christ.

Whilst the village has seen a lot of changes, the Church remains an important part of the community. Our focus is our Sunday worship at 10.00 am which can also be accessed via internet. We continue


